Assistant Instructor position:

- ~ **Description:** Assist Lead Instructor with course set up and tear-down. Support Lead Instructor by assisting them with instruction on some exercises, and monitoring students' performance on other exercises.
- ~ **Hours:** 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on either Saturday, Sunday, or both.
- ~ **Training:** On-the-job.

Lead Instructor position:

- ~ **Description:** This program is information, education and entertainment. Therefore, we are looking for outgoing people who is a communicator, an educator and an entertainer ... all wrapped up in one. It's the only way you will successfully engage up to 10 families at a time in an on-going, effective training process. Everything you will need to host the Workshops will be provided for you. You will simply pick up the fully-prepared and stocked equipment trailer from our Marietta headquarters sometime on Friday with everything you need, join your Assistant Instructor on the parking lot and serve as host to the Workshops on the weekend. As you establish yourself in your own position, you may be presented with the opportunity to invite your own Assistants to help you.

~Schedule / Hours:

During training, we expect an average of either one day each weekend of the month, or maybe 2 full weekends each month. We can work around your schedule. Once you assume the lead instructor role, you may expect to be offered as many as 2 venues per month, depending on demand. For each venue you wish to host, you will not need to host the classroom session, but you would need to attend the first hour of it to introduce yourself to your future students (from 6:00 until 7:00).

Then, host the driving session on the weekend from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. each necessary day.

~ The Training Process:

- 1- On-the-job training as an Assistant Instructor.
- 2- You would begin transitioning by taking the helm from me in small bites.
- 3- When we're both comfortable, I will work as your Assistant until you're comfortable.
- 4- You're on your own.
